

Picnics in the Park

The summer holidays can seem a long time for parents. If you are a family that receives free school meals, there is also extra food expense when finances are already stretched due to the cost of living crisis. The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme was established to address this issue. During August, activities were provided across the county; one such activity was a weekly Picnic in the Park, provided by Family Space. They asked us to join them in delivering sports and games to young people and their families as part of the picnics. These took place at King George V playing fields in Rowanfield. Sports, games, craft activities, and a good quality meal were provided for families of young people of school age. Over 300 meals were distributed to the families who came along over the four weeks.

The sessions had a real family feel to them, with the activities providing an opportunity for parents to talk with staff from Family Space whilst the young people were engaged in activities.

Each week we would offer different activities and games. To cope with the heat, we ran a series of water games, which went down a treat. Alongside these,



we also ran football, parachute games and other team games. Throughout the picnics, we had great opportunities to support and encourage young people and hear their stories. As the activities were walk-up sessions, we didn't know who or how many young people we would have each week, and we met many young people we had not met before.

It was terrific to have a young person who has been involved in our work, volunteering alongside us for one of the sessions. Providing young people with an opportunity to volunteer allows them to gain a greater understanding of the lives of other young people. Many young people in our region live in poverty, with the current inflationary pressures on food and fuel expected to worsen the situation. When young people volunteer, they see the reality of the crisis with their own eyes.

We are currently exploring options for helping more young people in this situation over the winter months. We are particularly keen to develop a resource for churches to support young people in their communities. Please get in touch with us if you would like to explore this.

All good things

Over the last five years, we have been supporting the youth work of the South Cheltenham Churches. For four years of this time, Hanna has been the youth worker responsible for the project. When we first started our partnership with the South Cheltenham Churches, it involved providing youth work after the departure of the previous youth worker. We ran one group for the first year prior to Hanna starting in 2018; this ensured some youth work continuity whilst we made the appointment. The partnership aimed to help the churches develop their youth work whilst supporting the youth worker. Over the four years since Hanna's appointment, the groups have grown. With the youth work in a healthy place, the churches have decided to bring the management of the youth work back inhouse. Rev. Nick Davies, the Team Rector, said, "This is a really exciting next step for our youth work programme and is a recognition of the hard work of Hanna and her team and the professional support that we have received from Youth for Christ." With this change, Hanna had to decide whether she would remain with the South Cheltenham Churches or with us. After her time in the role. Hanna felt the moment



was right for a change for her as well. As a result, Hanna will continue to work for us full-time, but in a new role. We have enjoyed supporting the work of South Cheltenham over the last five years. The project's success is not just in the numerical growth in the youth work, but the sustainable structure which is in place to help take the youth work forward to the next stage. We will continue to support the work of the South Cheltenham churches, but in a new capacity. We look forward to working with them and their new worker once they are in the post.

Hanna Looks back

As my time with South Cheltenham comes to a close, it has allowed me to reflect on our four-year partnership. It has been an interesting four years with many fond memories and unique challenges, a global pandemic being just one of them.

When I started, the role I took on had not existed in this structure. CNC had just joined the South Cheltenham Churches'

youth work partnership, and Youth for Christ

Gloucestershire was holding a new role with the churches. This new beginning was an excellent opportunity for me to get to know each church's worshipping and community styles and draw up new structures for the youth work. One of the most significant changes I implemented was

the creation of two-midweek youth groups for the young people, bringing together young people from all the churches with different backgrounds, theologies, and paths of faith.

This diverse group grew in its first year through young people joining after growing out of the children's group, group members bringing their friends along, and new families joining the different churches. increase in numbers and community feel was established in 2020 when the first lockdown started. At this point roughly ten young people, who had only recently gotten to know each other, really gelled over our Zoom nights. Even though Zoom was limited in many ways, it allowed for opportunities to get to know each other in ways we wouldn't have in person. It

provided brief glimpses into home life, decorated bedrooms, and of course, we all got to know each other's pets incredibly well!

Going into lockdown, I worried the group could become disengaged, but sharing their difficulties, faith, and successes online each week made the young people grow together in a way it would not

have otherwise. Several new members joined Rock Solid online for the first time and were welcomed as if they had always been part of the group. The support and encouragement the young people showed each other during this time was incredibly touching and still something I think about often. One of my favourite aspects of church life is the community it creates, which was visible in the youth group during a challenging time.

Surprisingly, the most considerable

Of course, the best part of the job is



seeing young people's lives changed by Jesus and seeing them grow up. Emily joined us during the first lockdown. She was in the choir at Pip and Jim's but hadn't been along to youth group before. Her mother contacted me during lockdown to ask if Emily could come along to a few sessions to fill her evenings. I was a bit nervous as this was the first young person to join during our "Zoom Era". But even though Emily was quiet at first, she would join in the discussions and share her thoughts. The rest of the group treated her like a long-term member from the first session. The real breakthrough came during game evenings when we played Among Us, an online game, as a group, and Emily won several rounds, a real bonding experience for everyone! Once we started to meet in person again, Emily came along and has been a regular member ever since, forming close friendships with the other girls in the group and coming on our weekend away with us. Seeing her becoming more confident and growing in her faith has been great.

Josh was a young person I saw once a

month, as he is a member of St Peter's choir. He didn't come along to youth group but did join us with some friends for our nerf gun Humans vs Zombies night. During this time, he had several good conversations with Michael, a gap year volunteer, who convinced him to try out Rock Solid. Josh came along to the first few sessions and was very quiet. However, over time, he became more confident. shared his opinion, and became more competitive with games. With time, I asked him to be a young leader for the group, meaning he would look out for newcomers and help keep discussions going when people were quiet. A role he thrived in, giving others the support he first needed and sharing his thoughts on God and his faith with others. Josh is now also in Underground, our young leaders' group. He has gone from a shy young lad to a confident, helpful, and caring young man, who looks out for others, and has developed a strong faith.

I am very grateful to be able to look back on my time in South Cheltenham with such memories and thankful for the time I spent there serving their young people.

Superheroes and royalty

This term, we have continued our assemblies at St Mark's Junior School, talking to the young people about how faith ties into their school values and how we can live them out in our daily lives.

We voted if Paul or the Queen would be treated better in a restaurant to reveal how Jesus cared for everyone equally, we dressed as everyday superheroes to demonstrate how everyone plays an important part in our community and hosted our own version of "Split or Steal" to show the importance of being truthful.

As always, we immensely enjoyed spending time in St Mark's and look forward to continuing our partnership in the new school year.



New partnerships

As the new academic year starts, we are pleased to be able to share two new partnerships we are developing. From September, we will collaborate with St. Luke's Church in Cheltenham to provide youth work. Hanna will join them as their youth worker for two days per week as part of her role with us. The joint working with St. Luke's has a special significance to us, as we had previously worked together when Wes was employed to do a similar role fifteen years ago. As we work closely to develop the existing youth provision, we will also be looking to expand the work further and establish outreach to local schools.

We are also recruiting a new youth worker in partnership with Abbey Church in Gloucester. This worker will have their time split 50/50 between ourselves and the work with Abbey Church. This worker will have a brief to develop our work in Gloucester. Building on our existing good relationships with churches and schools in the city, they will establish new projects as we seek to reach out to more young people.

We are also looking to recruit an intern who can take an opportunity to grow and develop whilst they learn youth work skills. This role will suit someone post sixth form or university looking to gain experience or trying to work out their next steps.

These are exciting developments that will allow us to support more young people. Please pray as we seek to recruit that God provides the right people.
