New signing



If you are a football fan, January can be a tense moment as you keep an eye out to see who your team signs before the 31st January transfer deadline. We don't have to worry about a transfer deadline, but we

do have news of our own signing. Last term, we were trying to recruit a new youth worker. We were very aware that it is currently very hard to find people, many posts remain unfilled, with few suitable candidates available. Following the recruitment process, we have appointed Matt Craig as our new Youth Work Lead. He will join us sometime after Easter.

Matt is currently the youth worker at Hillingdon Park Baptist Church in London, and also has considerable retail

management experience. It is not the first time we have employed a youth worker from Hillingdon Park Baptist. One of their previous youth workers was Paul, our current Centre Director. When Paul

The opportunity to employ Matt full time arose just before Christmas. We were not expecting to employ anyone full-time, and whilst our finances are healthy, the extra hours made it a challenge. As we all stopped and considered what this would mean, we asked God to provide. Over the next three weeks, we saw a

significant increase in income. We had shared our need with a small group of people, and we were constantly blown away by their generosity. Coupled with the money raised by walking the Cotswold

Way in 2021, we were in a position to fund a full-time post for the first couple of years. We will still need to raise more funds over time, not least due to the cost of living crisis. What was undeniable, was God's provision for the post.

We are very excited about Matt joining us. He will be able to help us extend our work and take it into new areas. He brings enthusiasm and passion for our work, backed up with an excellent level of experience. He has a track record of delivering good youth work. Following his appointment, Matt said, "I have always admired the work of Youth for Christ, reaching out to young people in the local community. I am incredibly excited to be joining Paul and the team at Youth for Christ Gloucestershire and can't wait to get started."

Please pray for Matt and his family as they make the move to Gloucestershire. We know they will particularly value prayer for their house move and for school places for their two children.

Fueling faith

Hanna started her role as a youth worker for St Luke's Church in September and has been welcomed with open arms by the church family.

She currently plans the children and youth sessions for a Sunday morning, runs the youth sessions, is the contact person for students and 20-30s, and is involved in the

Sunday services. The youth group consists not only of St Luke's regulars but also newcomers and young people who have outgrown the children's group, so during her first month, Hanna focused on the young people getting to know one another. They had their first social in November, a great evening of watching Shrek, eating popcorn and pizza, and



coming to the services and wanted to learn more about Jesus, faith, and religion. She had an old Bible that she found quite confusing. We gave her a Youth for Christ Youth Bible, which is simpler to use, so she could get more familiar with it. There are also sections that help her think through issues facing young people. Alongside

> this, Patrick and Hanna are halfway through running a Christianity Explored course for this age group and are encouraged at the conversations that have started based on it.

As part of her role, Hanna has been going to St John's Primary School every week to lead their collective worship. She has been telling Bible stories that align with

enjoying sparklers, which was a good bonding experience for the whole group. The church has seen a sudden growth in their 20-30s age group, with several people joining on a Sunday morning who are discovering Jesus for the first time. Hanna has been reading the book of Mark with a young woman who has started the school's values. During the winter term, they looked at courage and humility by exploring Queen Esther's story and some of Jesus' parables. With the start of 2023, they've been exploring the Lord's Prayer, making it applicable to them, and learning it off by heart together. Hanna is supported by Rev. Patrick Wheaton, the vicar from St Luke's, and a team of 4 young people in charge of setting up and running the collective worship.

A year 6 student has said, "I like collective worship because it is interactive, interesting and a fun way to learn, I like that there are different people teaching us. I enjoy the singing and Hanna has lots of fun with us all with different games."

Last term brought many opportunities for

under God's love. She has shown a passion and care for the children at Saint John's, our church of England Primary School, helping us deliver biblical collective worship. We are so excited that under Hanna's leadership, we have been able to start a lunchtime Christian Union for Years 4,5 & 6 called Faithfu(e)I. Gospel ministry seeking to flourish in our parish in partnership with Youth for Christ.'

It is really good to be working in partnership with St. Luke's once again. Many years ago, we shared a worker, Wes Bell. A number of the congregation have commented about how nice it is to be working together again. We are looking forward to seeing the youth work develop in the church.

At a time when many churches are struggling with reduced numbers of young people, we are committed to supporting the local church. We want to see youth work flourishing across the churches in the area. We work with a

before the pandemic, and have been keen to come back and bring their friends along. The group consists of roughly fifteen students with different faith backgrounds and has been a lot of fun to establish and run.

Patrick said, 'Hanna has brought a great energy to our vision at St Luke's to be rooted in Jesus Christ and flourishing number of churches, providing access to the Youth for Christ online resources, as well as supporting youth groups with visits, advice and sometimes practical support. We always try to go into schools in conjunction with youth workers from churches in the area. Whilst this is not always possible, we want to try to do local mission with local churches wherever possible.



Together

One of our values is partnership; we believe we are better when we are working together with others united in mission. We value mutual partnerships. These are many and varied. We work in collaboration with churches such as St. Luke's, where Hanna delivers youth work; West Cheltenham Team Ministry, helping to deliver youth work and also in schools such as St. Mark's Junior delivering collective worship. Our Big Weekender is a partnership between ourselves and Swindon Youth for Christ. The weekend is also a partnership with local churches, demonstrating, that when we do something together, it can be bigger and better. We know without those of you who pray and support our work financially, we would not be able to work with young people. It is for this reason, we will always refer to you as partners.

Another one of our partnerships is with Youth for Christ Cyprus. Over the last few years, we have developed a strong partnership with each other. We have prayed as teams and Paul talks and prays with their National Director, Loukios, on a regular basis. Last year, two members of their team paid us a visit. Those times were spent building relationships as well as investing in training and allowing their team explore how we do youth work. In 2020, Paul was due to visit Cyprus along with a small team. The team were going to be involved in the Cyprus annual youth camp and Paul would be the main speaker. Due to Covid, this did not happen, but three years later, plans are in place to make the trip this summer. To this end, Paul and the team will be fundraising, to not only cover their costs, but also bless the team in Cyprus. Paul had chosen to undertake a local one day cycling sportive of 64 miles. At our last Trustees' meeting, it was suggested that Paul and Helen, one of the trustees, should do the event together, on a tandem!

Helen has never cycled 64 miles, and neither of them have ridden a tandem for more than a mile. Their only option of escape was hoping we could not find a tandem to use. This was quickly dashed when a suitable bike was found in a few days. As a result, they will be taking on the challenge on 13th May. It does seem incredibly appropriate, that we fund our partnership with the ultimate partnership challenge. Why not help us extend the partnership further by offering to join us. Big Questions

the questions that Paul got bombarded with by Year 6 students at St. Mark's Junior School in December. As part of the RE curriculum, the students gather evidence from a Christian to support the existence of God.

feature a lot of testimony as well as some deep theological and philosophical discussion. We are always amazed at the

depth of thinking of the students.

Throughout this term, Paul and Hanna will be visiting all the classes in the school to answer their "Big Questions". Last year, we created boxes in which they could write their big questions

that they would like to discuss with us. Based on the Year 6 students, we know we will have some interesting discussions.

The man who stands on eggs

Just before Christmas, Paul was in church when a pupil from a local school came up to him and asked "Are you the man who stands on eggs?" A few weeks later. two siblings from the same school were discussing assemblies with Paul. They were recounting assemblies we had taken over the years, many of which Paul had forgotten. After a while, one of the siblings said, "All the best assemblies are done by Youth for Christ".

Over the autumn term, we were involved in nineteen assemblies in three different primary schools. In total, these schools have over 600 students. During the Spring term, we will deliver another sixteen, with a possibility of more being added in a

Collective Worship should engage students and make them think. We do this through standing on eggs, playing quizzes and games, retelling Bible stories and carrying out science experiments. All the while, the students and staff are engaged and having fun. Both siblings turned up a day later at the CU, despite it being their first day at school. They have come along regularly ever since, and it's been nice to see them form friendships with the other students in the group.

Anyone for coffee

It is no secret that we as a team like our coffee! In our Autumn Term Unwrapped, we estimated that we drank 400 coffees during work last term. There is a distinct possibility that this estimate could be too low! We also like good coffee and want it to be ethically sourced. We have developed a relationship with a coffee company based in North Devon, who are producing coffee on our behalf. This means that you can buy a high quality coffee, secure in the knowledge that it is ethically sourced. You can even read about the farmers who have supplied the coffee. As you sip your morning brew, you will also be making a difference to the lives of young people. All the work is handled by the coffee company, who then pass on a donation for each bag sold.

Steve Nuth, the owner of Dancing Road Coffee said "Five years ago, I learnt enough about filmmaking to tell the story of how coffee can be used to fund and facilitate mission. I was able to visit a mountain region in Uganda where coffee was being sold in order to fund, Christian mission, education and healthcare. I came back to the UK with a fire in my heart to try and bring their coffee to sell in the UK. It is exciting to work with Youth for Christ Gloucestershire, so that the profits made from every transaction from farm to cup helps to fund the spreading of the good news of Jesus."

You can buy the coffee in individual bags as beans or ground coffee. You can also set up a regular subscription order. With five coffees to choose from, you can try to find your favourite.
