


#### Best weekend ever



In October, we held our first Living Beyond residential in Chepstow. Seventeen young people joined as we explored the importance of putting Jesus at the centre of our lives. We also looked at how we can be more effective in sharing our faith with others.

The weekend was packed full of sessions exploring the theme along with various prayer activities and worship. The young people also enjoyed various games

including ultimate frisbee and a fantastic campfire.

It was a special residential for lots of reasons. We had young people from a variety of Cheltenham and Gloucester churches, many of whom come to Underground. Two young people from Taunton joined us along with team members from Taunton Youth for Christ, and two more young people came from London. Even though many of the young people didn't know each other, there was a great atmosphere. The young people quickly built strong and supportive

relationships. As we explored the theme together, they were quick to encourage one another and felt comfortable worshipping together.

A number of young people were incredibly anxious about coming to the weekend, but they joined in, and along with the encouragement of others they had a great weekend. It takes courage to go to a weekend when you don't know many people. It is a real testament to the character of the young people that they persevered. Watching the character of the other young people shine through as they welcomed them and made them feel at home was also great to see.

We saw a number of young people really open up about their personal faith, and the challenges they face. The young people also returned home with a greater understanding and confidence in sharing they faith with their friends.

Residentials make a massive impact on the lives of young people, they may take a huge amount of work, but they are worth every bit of effort.

#### Take a Break Away

The clock is ticking for the early bird discount for our February residential.

Break Away is a fun weekend away for 11-18 year olds (school years 7-13) and their youth leaders from churches across Gloucestershire to explore faith and build community.

The weekend will include playing games (they might get messy), engaging worship, asking big questions, sports, delving into the Bible and taking part in a variety of other fun activities together. Weather permitting, we might have a campfire. The weekend is aimed at anyone who wants to grow in their faith or learn more about life's big questions.

You will get to know others in your youth group and meet groups from churches across the region. You might meet people from school whom you didn't know went to church. You might make new friends. The team at Youth for Christ know the challenge of being a young person trying to explore faith and serve Jesus. While following Jesus can be challenging, we also believe it can be fun and exciting.

We will be returning to The Poplars near Ledbury. The Poplars has en-suite bedrooms. No wet tents and cold muddy showers here!

Anyone between the ages of 11-18 year (school years 7-13) can come as part of a youth group with their youth leaders. If you have no youth group to come with, you can come without a leader but we would ask for an email to be sent to office@yfcgloucestershire.co.uk to ensure we have adequate leaders to support you. The Early Bird rate is £90 by 7th November. After this date you pay the regular price of £100. Prices are the same for young people and leaders.

Where finance is a real challenge for you, we would request you contact us in confidence, to discuss how we can help. We would not want a young person to miss out due to finance. We will work with you to see how this can be overcome.

#### **Moving on**

After five years on the team, Hanna has felt the call to a new role and a slightly different area of ministry. From November, she will be working with refugees.

providing support and assistance to them as they build a new life. We are sad to see Hanna go, but excited for her as she starts a new chapter. Over the last six months, we have been using Hanna's skills to teach English as a foreign language to three young people with refugee or asylum seeker status. We had been exploring the possibilities of extending this work in

schools as well as developing a youth club for young asylum seekers and refugees. It is no surprise that Hanna now feels that God is moving her in this new direction.

Over the last five years Hanna has been involved in a wide range of our work,

developing youth work in South Cheltenham and latterly in St. Luke's; she walked the Cotswold Way, played a key role as we navigated the pandemic, and has been involved in multiple residentials. During this time, we have seen her develop and know that we are sending out a capable and willing worker. She will be greatly missed by the team and young

people, but we wish her well and look forward to hearing all of her news.



#### Hanna looks back

After five years, I'm finishing my time at Youth for Christ Gloucestershire. As much as I am looking forward to starting a new challenge, it feels weird to be leaving. I have greatly enjoyed my time here and have seen God do some amazing things in the lives of young people.

When I started, I joined the South Cheltenham team and had opportunity to combine the individual youth groups and move the overall youth work in a new direction.

Surprisingly, we saw a significant increase in numbers during the lockdowns, which continued once we met back in person. Even though the group grew significantly in these times, the young people were great at welcoming new members and making them feel welcome and part of the group. Seeing the young people form strong friendships and meet up in their

spare time was great.

The most encouraging aspect of the group was seeing them take their faith seriously. I saw young people give their lives to Jesus



on weekends away, get baptised, or start to get involved in church life and take on responsibilities.

I also got to mentor a young person struggling with a recent diagnosis. We met up regularly to talk and check in on how they were adjusting to life. I saw her go from a shy and withdrawn individual to an outgoing and confident teenager who

supports and encourages others who have been through similar situations. She is outspoken about what is right and is always the first to help a friend in need. This has been wonderful to see.

Over the last year, I have worked with St Luke's in various ways, from supporting and leading the youth group to reestablishing their

toddler group and developing their social media. Running a toddler group was completely new to me and challenging at times. Several of the parents have started visiting church off the back of it. One mother had her child christened at St. Luke's too! When she had to return to work in September, she mentioned how much the group had meant to her as she hadn't been able to visit one with her first child due to the pandemic. Our toddler group had enabled her to make friends with other parents and spend a morning a week doing something special with her child. She also mentioned how she had taken to going to church for herself and how nice it had been to share that experience with her wider family at the Christening.

In the last few months, I have worked with refugees and asylum seekers, teaching them English, which has been challenging and rewarding. I've been trusted with their stories, asked for advice and been able to show support in practical ways. The lessons started quietly, coaxing out language and gauging the different levels of each student. As the lessons end, there hasn't been a single week where I haven't been able to laugh with my students and share funny stories, hear about their school lives or if they finally won one of their weekly football matches. All of them have shown an increase in their understanding and use of their English language, mainly


due to their hard work and dedication to learning and speaking more. Sometimes, even small successes can feel huge. I have been teaching one Year 7 student who could barely introduce himself. Due to this, he has been struggling in school and not connecting with his classmates. Early on, I realised he loved cars and incorporated them into our lessons. A few weeks later, his older sister told me he talked with a classmate

about what cars

he does and doesn't like on his way home. He wouldn't have had the confidence or ability to do so a few months ago. His sister and I celebrated this as the big win it was.

I have enjoyed and valued my time at Youth for Christ Gloucestershire. When I started, I said that being a youth worker is the best job, and I still stand by that. It is a privilege to walk alongside young people in their faith, listen, support, and point them to God. I was surprised when I felt God had given me a new challenge but excited to take it up. Even though youth work might not be my paid profession anymore, I will always be a youth worker at heart and hope to get involved in it voluntarily once I have settled into my new role.

I look forward to exploring a new calling after being in youth ministry for over six years, and I am leaving with a grateful heart.





#### Fun and Food in the Park

In August, we once again had the pleasure of working alongside the amazing team at Family Space, providing Holiday Activities and Food (HAF). The HAF programme is designed to provide support to children in receipt of free school meals through holiday periods.

We ran various organized games including football and rebound as well as several water-based games which proved very popular. We also helped serve food and engaged with the many families who attended.

One young person came along for a session but didn't want to be there. We spent some time with them on a toy archery set. After a while, he began to teach younger children how to play. He gradually grew in confidence and left the session having enjoyed themselves. Other families came to make the most of the one good meal that they could enjoy that day without worrying about the cost.

Four sessions were held throughout August, with 100 people attended each of the four days. We have started talking about how we can develop it further for August 2024!



#### The Big Christmas Bash

Friday 15th December, sees the first Big Christmas Bash take place in Kingfisher Church, Gloucester. The evening will be full of fun, festive cheer, food and chance to explore what Christmas really means.

We are running this in partnership with a

number of Gloucester churches. If you have a youth group in the area, bring them along for a great evening. This is a free event, including the food!

#### **Showcase and Commissioning**

On 16th September, we held a Showcase and Commissioning service. Young people shared stories of how their lives had been changed through our ministry. We also shared stories of the things God has done over the last year. We commissioned all of our staff, volunteers and trustees as they started a new school year. It was great to be joined by a number of people from the church Matt worked with in Hillingdon as we celebrated the start of his ministry in Gloucestershire.

#### **Gloucester Growth**

During the Summer we were approached by St Catharine's Church in Gloucester to help them with their Sunday evening young people's group.

Since September, Matt has enjoyed working with the volunteers, getting to know the young people, and introducing new games including the Youth for Christ game Yetti.

The group is made up of young people who attend church and those who have little to no faith background. It has been

encouraging to see 12-15 young people attend most weeks.

Due to Matt helping with St Catharine's, we have been able to engage with some of the youth workers within Gloucester. Matt and Paul are now part of a monthly group of Gloucester based youth workers and volunteers that meet to share and pray together. In December, we will be working in partnership with them to organise and run a Christmas event for the young people of Gloucester providing an evening of fun, food, music, and a gospel message.

#### **Back to School**

September is always a busy time reestablishing work in schools. In her role with St. Luke's. Hanna has restarted the lunchtime Faithfu(e)I club in St John's Primary School. They have been making their way through the big Bible stories and getting to know the characters of the Old Testament. The group started out small; we often had around four young people show up regularly, but now we have at least 15 young people a session. Given the young age of the pupils, it is a fast-paced group, filled with games and activities, during which we tell them the Bible stories and ask for their opinions. We have had great conversations about Jesus, heaven. and how to treat others. It has been encouraging to see the children bring their friends along and engaging in the stories, asking questions, and sharing their opinions.

In September, Matt began leading the Christian Union at Bournside School every Monday at the end of the school day. He is joined by Becca, the Youth Worker at St. Matthew's Church.

We started the term challenging the students to invite their friends along to the group. It has been encouraging to see them take this seriously. A member of the group invited a friend who came at the start of the term, they in turn brought



three friends along the following week!
Some young people have a strong faith,
whilst others are starting a journey of
exploring faith. Recently, we have enjoyed
discussing what it means to be generous
with our money, gifts and our time as well
as playing games, eating snacks and
providing space for the students to share
and pray together.

Alongside this work, we have also led Collective Worship in four schools. We have continued our fortnightly sessions in St. Mark's Junior School, and half termly sessions in Shurdington Primary. We also led or first session in Kingsholm Primary. with more to follow later in the year. We finished of the first half term with a session in St. John's Primary in Cheltenham. Our collective worship sessions feature a mixture of games, illustrations, Bible stories, prayer and lots of fun. The teachers are always willing to volunteer, albeit rather reluctantly at points. We want to bring vibrancy and fun tio collective worship to make it a valuable learning experience. As we were leaving a school recently, a member of staff stopped us and said "I love these sessions". We do as well, watching a few hundred children having fun and learning about Jesus is hard to beat!

#### **Growing through service**

Over the years, we have seen young people from our young leaders group, Underground, do many different things. Some have been involved in leading Christian Unions, some have taken gap years with churches or other organisations. We recently visited St. Andrew's Church in Churchdown and one of them was leading

the worship.

Underground exists to help young people gain the character. confidence and skills needed for them to make an impact around them. The current group consists of twelve young people all between twelve and seventeen years of age. All of them are people who can influence those around them, but we all need some advice and quidance. We don't talk about one leadership

style, but look to help each young person find out how God wants to use them and to discover the skills and gifts that God has given them. Alongside all of this, we seek to help them learn how to share their faith with their friends in a positive and effective way.

One of the newest members of the group has just set up a Christian Union in Crypt School. After approaching the school for

permission to start the group, they met for the first time in October, with nine young people turning up for the first session. To help them get off the ground, we gave them a copy of our Yetti game for use at the Christian Union.

Another one of the young people, lan, has started to join Paul when he visits churches. This may involve taking part where appropriate. lan also shared about his involvement with our

work at our recent Showcase and Commissioning service. Other young people will be exploring other opportunities with other mentors.



#### **Cyprus Summer Camp**

This summer Paul and Nia travelled to Cyprus for the Youth for Christ summer camp. It was Cyprus Youth for Christ's first camp since the pandemic, with thirty-eight young people attending from across the island.

There is something very special about going out of your normal environment and sharing Jesus with people. It is both challenging and refreshing. The theme for the week was "Out of the Wild", exploring the grace of God and how that moves us to a place of freedom. Throughout the trip we saw xa number of young people make a decision to follow Jesus for the first time. One young person came to the camp from a difficult situation. During the camp they opened up to one of the camp leaders and made a decision to follow Jesus. During a time of worship, they said they felt peace for the first time. Upon their return from camp, the Pastor of the church they attended said that if he had not know this young person had gone to camp, he would want to know what had happened to them as the change in their life was staggering.

Another young person drew pictures during the talks as a way of taking notes. She is an amazing artist and her pictorial notes were a great way for her to process what was being said. Other young people

returned from camp sharing about how they had made decisions to follow Jesus. One young person wanted to understand what it meant to "give your life to Jesus". Without a Christian upbringing, it was new language to her. When it was explained that it involve putting Jesus first she began

to understand. The following morning, she chose to give her life to Jesus.

One wonderful aspect of the team was the wide range of nationalities involved. In a team of ten people, ten nationalities were represented. Despite this, and not knowing each other, everyone came together and had one thing in common, a love for Jesus and a desire for young people's lives to be changed by Him.
