We have been awarded a grant from the Spring Harvest Seed Fund to enable us to recruit someone to provide additional hours to help develop youth work with the church. God would reveal opportunities to us. During this time, we have been approached by another organisation about developing some specific youth work which could be based in Leckhampton. We have also had some encounters with young people, with one young person keen to join a youth club when it is set up. It is early days, but we are excited about the possibilities.

This is just one example of how we are working to support local churches develop their youth work. We are currently recruiting for a joint worker with Hillview Church in Brockworth, and we have been providing youth work at St. Catharine's Church in Gloucester and will support their new youth work over the next term. We are also working with a couple of other churches to support them as they seek to develop a missional aspect to their youth work. Alongside all of this we are continuing to resource churches through events such as The Big Bash, the Break Away residential, through the Youth for Christ resources, networking meetings for youth workers and much more.

The Anniversary Challenges

A huge thank you to everyone who has undertaken one or more of our 50th Anniversary challenges. We have completed four of our five challenges. Fifteen people walked from Tewkesbury to Gloucester, ten people attempted the 100 mile cycle challenge, three people ran the Cheltenham Half Marathon, and five people walked the 24 miles of the Glevum Way around Gloucester. So far the team have raised over £10,000, with the total still growing. With one event remaining, we hope that our final total will get to £12,500.

Our final challenge is to row 197.4km (1974 was the year we started). We will be doing this on two rowing machines in the office on Friday 18th October. The team are preparing to row a good distance each, but we are looking for other people to join us and share the load. We will start at 7am, for anyone who wants to get a session in before work, and hope to finish by midnight. We are breaking the day up into 15 minute segments and would like people to sign up for a segment. If each person

The feedback we received throughout the evening from both young people and youth leaders was extremely positive.

A term in Schools



Collective Worship

During the summer term, we led collective worship at St Mark's Junior School, Christ Church Primary and Shurdington Primary. As always, these have been characterised by a lot of laughter, most of the time caused by pupil and (sometimes reluctant) teacher participation – and occasionally caused by some incredible acting by the team! We have shared simple biblical truths with random demonstrations including eating mousse, a toothpaste race, science experiments, a pied face and many more. During the autumn term, we will be leading around 20 collective worship sessions.

Faithfuel

With the arrival of Alice as the Ministry Assistant at St. Luke's Church, we have taken a more back seat at the Faithfuel lunchtime club at St. John's Primary. We are continuing to provide support, rather than running the sessions. Lots of young people have joined the club throughout this term, and it has been great to see how they each approach the activities and questions in different ways – from always including their dogs in their prayer response, to rational evaluation of the Bible, managing to always respond with some sort of excited dance move, to very deep questions. They keep us on our toes!

Transition Lessons

During the Summer term, we led transition lessons for Year 6 students moving up to secondary school. The lessons include tips for settling in to a new school, how to choose and make friends wisely, how to tie the knot in a school tie and who we can turn to for help. Students are given the opportunity to share about their fears and excitement about going to a new school. The team shared about how they all deal with challenges they face and give testimony of how Jesus has supported them through challenging times.



Bournside Christian Union

In the Spring term, twelve young people from the Bournside Christian Union made the decision to follow Jesus. This term we have helped them on their faith journey by introducing them to how to pray, listen to God's voice and read the Bible; something that they feel comfortable doing in their own time. They have each been given a copy of 'We Are Satellites' book to read during the summer. It has been particularly incredible to see how a young girl, not from a Christian home but brought along by her friend, has gone from being on the outside of discussions, to making a decision to follow Jesus, downloading the Bible app on her phone and now having the confidence to really participate in bible studies.

Basketball and Jesus

On a sunny day in June, the team arrived at Alderman Knight School for a full day of PE lessons. The lessons were part of a Religion and World Views activity day.

Three classes each had a double lesson slot where they progressed from learning basic basketball skills (the different types of passes, dribbling skills and practising shooting) to a game in two teams. It was great to see some of the young people who hadn't done much basketball before get involved and grow in confidence, as well as some of the more experienced ones helping the others out and giving them a chance to do well.

We shared the account from the Bible of Peter walking on water to come to Jesus, explaining how we, like Peter, we can ask Jesus to help us when we are struggling. He also linked this to their school values of courage. Who knew that basketball and trusting Jesus go hand in hand?!

Break Away 2025



Break Away is back in February 2025.

February 2025 may seem a fair while away, but bookings for our Break Away residential is now open.

Break Away is a fun weekend away for 11-18 year olds (school years 7-13) and their youth leaders from churches across Gloucestershire to explore faith and build community. This years residential will take place from 14th-16th February 2025.

The weekend will include playing games, (they might get messy), engaging worship, asking big questions, sports, delving into the Bible and taking part in a variety of other fun activities together. Weather permitting, we might have a campfire. The weekend is aimed at anyone who wants to grow in their faith or learn more about life's big questions.

Last year, we kicked off the weekend with Jon Jackal, and we are already planning our surprise "Big Event" for our next Break Away. Archery will be back for 2025, along with a whole host of other activities.

You will get to know others in your youth group and meet groups from churches across the region. You might meet people from school whom you didn't know went to church. You might make new friends. The team at Youth for Christ know the challenge of being a young person trying to explore faith and serve Jesus. While following Jesus can be challenging, we also believe it can be fun and exciting.

We will be returning to The Poplars near Ledbury. The Poplars has en-suite bedrooms. No wet tents and cold muddy showers here!

Anyone between the ages of 11-18 year (school years 7-13) can come as part of a youth group with their youth leaders. If you have no youth group to come with, you can come without a leader but we would ask for an email to be sent to office@yfcgloucestershire.co.uk to ensure





we have adequate leaders to support you.

The first four bookings were placed within 48 hours of the opening of the booking page, and interest is already hotting up. The residential normally sells out, so we always advise early booking. Not only do you guarantee your place, but you can also take advantage of the early bird price until 31st October. We have had to increase prices slightly this year. The early bird price for young people and leaders is £95, but this raises to £110 after this date. We have been working hard to create a system to allow for payments in instalments. For early bird payments, you will be able to spread the payments across three months. After the early bird deadline, payments will need to be made across two months.

Where finance is a real challenge for you, we would request you contact us in confidence, to discuss how we can help. We would not want a young person to miss out due to finance. We can work with you to see how this can be overcome.

Exploring work

We sometimes get asked if students can join us for a week of work experience. This is an opportunity for a young person to spend a week with us, exploring what working life is like, whist giving them opportunities to try out new skills. This year, we were joined by Daniel. We asked him to write about his time with us.

"In January, my school told me and my friends that all students in Year 10 would be doing work experience for a week during July. This was something that I was quite unsure about since I didn't know what it would be like and I didn't know what to expect. Youth for Christ agreed for me to join them for the week. This turned out to be a fun and insightful week.

During the week, we went to three primary schools including Shurdington. There I was involved in helping Year 6 children prepare for Year 7, by teaching them what not to do and how to treat others. I helped the Year 6s learn to tie a tie, one student made the tie too tight she couldn't take it off!

I also designed postcards to give to churches to help the young people grow their faith. Other tasks I completed included sorting items in the office and IT. I also chose the pictures for the Year 6 lesson to help them understand what they were being taught.

My work experience with Youth for Christ has been worthwhile, I have a better understanding of having a job and having responsibilities. And I'm really impressed by the work of Youth for Christ and their heart for working with children and young people."

Once again, we joined Family Space, to provide Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) in Hesters Way during the Summer Holiday. For the first time in four years, we were affected by the weather. Twice we were forced to relocate from King George V play fields to the Oasis Centre to avoid heavy rain. Despite these more challenging weeks, we still provided sports, craft and food to a good number of families. During the four sessions, 300-400 meals were provided to families entitled to free school meals. We even managed to run our very own HAF Olympics for the families to join in with.

The HAF sessions are an excellent opportunities to interact with young people as well as there parents. Every year, we also encounter parents whom we have previously worked with when they were young people involved in our schools' work. It is a good opportunity to reconnect with them and once more, input into their lives.
